
## Lepra amara





Previously known as Pertusaria amara.

Identification: A crustose lichen. Thallus grey, thin to thick, with clearly defined borders. Sprinkled with punctiform soralia up to 1mm diameter, containing white soredia with a bitter taste when 'sampled' with a moist finger. Apothecia vary rare.

**Chemistry:** Soralia KC+ violet (fleeting), P- (but P+ red for 25% of specimens).

**Similar species:** Visually similar to *Lepra albescens* (*Pertusaria albescens*) but without a bitter taste and soralia are always KC- *Lepra pulvinata* is only found on veteran trees and has a warty thallus with smaller, neater raised soralia.

**Habitat:** Very common on trees, sometimes found overgrowing mosses on the ground or on rock.

**Distribution**: Throughout Britain and Ireland.
